# 7. PROPOSED GENERAL FUND BUDGET- FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024

Adopting the proposed Millage Rate for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 in the amount of 4.8500 Mills, which is 9.82% higher than the Roll-Back Rate of 4.4162 Mills, to balance the General Fund for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

A motion was made by Council Member Block was seconded by Council Member Conover to open discussion regarding the new recycling price increase for budget-Fiscal year 2023/2024.

Mayor Deno and the Council Members have approved a plan to split the cost of recycling charges with the residents of The Village of Virginia Gardens. Here are the key points:

Residents will be responsible for paying half of the recycling charges, which amounts to \$7.5 annually.

The Village of Virginia Gardens will subsidize the other half of the recycling charges, covering the remaining cost.

At this time we opened up a public hearing at 5:40p.m and closed at 5:45 p.m. The motion passed 5-0.

This initiative will result in a reduction in the property tax millage rate to 4.8500.

This plan aims to make recycling more affordable for residents while also lowering the property tax burden by reducing the millage rate. It's a positive step towards promoting recycling and providing financial relief to the community.
